

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING INTOXICATING LIQUOR AND PROVIDING

A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION HEREOF.

The Village Council of the Village of Moose Lake, Carlton County, Minnesota, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. INTOXICATING LIQUOR DEFINED. Whenever used in this ordinance, the term "intoxicating liquor" shall include ethyl alcohol and any liquid of any kind, potable as a beverage containing one-half of one per cent or more of alcohol by volume, and also any liquid for any kind, potable as a beverage which is in fact intoxicating, and as defined by National and State Law.

Section 2. UNLAWFUL ACTS. No person shall manufacture, sell, give away, possess, transport, solicit, receive or take any order for intoxicating liquor; except that this prohibition shall not apply to ethyl alcohol intended for chemical, mechanical, medicinal, pharmaceutical, scientific, industrial or sacramental purposes, if a license has been secured as provided by State Law; nor to any liquor intended for such purposes, if a license has been secured as provided by law.

Section 3. PENALTY, DEFINITIONS, EFFECTIVE DATE.

Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by fine of not more than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars or imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, plus, in either case, the costs of the prosecution. The word "person" as used in this ordinance shall include firms and corporations. All provisions of ordinance inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, and this ordinance shall be effective on passage and publication according to law.
