

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1, 4, and 5, OF ORDINANCE No. 25 ENTITLED:  
 "An ordinance establishing a Municipal Liquor Dispensary" dated Dec.17,  
 1935.

The Council of the Village of Moose Lake, Minnesota, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of Ordinance # 25, entitled "An Ordinance establishing a Municipal Liquor Dispensary" is amended to read as follows:

A Municipal Liquor Dispensary is hereby established to be operated within this Municipality, for the sale of liquor potable as a beverage and containing more than 3.2 % alcohol by weight, both for consumption at such dispensary and on such premises by the drink and in the sealed or closed receptacle or container for removal from the premises. No person shall sell, barter or otherwise dispose of intoxicating liquor, nor shall a sale be made by anyone outside of such dispensary or by anyone not employed in and by said dispensary. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to mix or prepare liquor for consumption in any public place of business or to consume liquor in such places outside of the dispensary. No liquor shall be sold or consumed on a public highway or in an automobile.

Section 2. Section 4 of the ordinance referred to in Section 1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

No sale of intoxicating liquor shall be made after one A.M. on Sunday, nor between the hours of one A.M. and three o'clock P.M. on any Memorial Day, nor between the hours of one A.M. and eight o'clock P.M. on any election day in the district in which such election shall be held. No "on sale" shall be made between the hours of one A.M. and eight o'clock A.M. on any week day. No "off sale" shall be made before eight o'clock A.M. or after ten o'clock P.M. of any day. However in cities of the first class and in all cities, villages, and boroughs located within a radius of 15 miles of cities of the first class, "off sale" may be made only until eight o'clock P.M. on any day except Saturday on which day "off sale" may be made until ten o'clock P.M. No "off sale" shall be made on New Years Day; Memorial Day, May 30; Independence Day, July 4th; Thanksgiving Day; or Christmas Day December 25th; but on the evening preceding such days, if the sale of liquor is not otherwise prohibited on such evenings, "off sale" may be made until the o'clock P.M. except that no "off sale" shall be made on December 24th after eight o'clock P.M.

Section 3. Section 5 of the ordinance referred to in Section 1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) No pool or billiard table shall be kept in the dispensary or any rooms connected therewith; nor shall anyone on such premises keep, possess or operate on such premises or in any room adjoining or connecting therewith, any slot machines, dice or any other gambling device or permit the same to be kept or used. No gambling shall be permitted on such premises nor shall any person of a known immoral character or any disorderly person be permitted on such premises.

(b) No other business than the sale of liquors shall be carried on by the dispensary or by any person employed therein during the time so employed and in conjunction therewith, except that cigars, cigarettes,

snuff, tobacco, non-intoxicating malt beverages, and soft drinks may be sold at retail both "on sale" and "off sale" during the hours the dispensary is open for the sale of intoxicating liquor.

(c) No liquor shall be sold either for consumption upon the premises or for removal therefrom to a person who is in an intoxicated condition.

(d) No liquor shall be sold to a minor.

(e) No person shall be permitted to loaf or loiter about the dispensary habitually.

(f) No premises shall be leased for a dispensary upon which taxes, assessments or other legal public levies are delinquent or unpaid.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from the date of its publication. Passed by the Village Council this 24th day of April, 1950.
