

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 37, WHICH  
AMENDED ORDINANCE NO. 25 ESTABLISHING A  
MUNICIPAL LIQUOR DISPENSARY

The Village Council of the Village of Moose Lake, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of Ordinance number 37 is hereby amended to read as follows:

" A Municipal Dispensary is hereby established to be operated within this municipality for the sale of liquor potable as a beverage and containing more than 3.2 percent alcohol by weight, both for the consumption at such dispensary and on such presies by the drink and in the sealed or closed receptacle or container for removal from the premises. No person shall sell, barter or otherwise dispose of intoxicating liquor, nor shall a sale be made by anyone outside of such dispensary or by anyone not employed in and by said dispensary, except that a license for the sale of such intoxicating liquor may be issued at the discretion of the Council to any bona fide Club existing and qualified for such a license under the laws in force at the time of any such Club application. Sale of intoxicating liq or by a Club shall be defined as only "on sale" by the drink on the presises and not by the bottle or off the premises. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to mix or prepare liquor for consumption in any public place of business or to consume liquor in such places putside the duspensary or such Club as may be licensed under this Ordinance. No liquor shall be sold or consumed on a public highway or in an automobile."

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its passage and publication. Passed by the Village Council this 7th day of December, 1959, and published in the Star Gaxette, in the Village of Moose Lake, Minnesota, on December 17th, 1959.
